Is calcium supplied by lime/limestone?

Calcium is naturally in the grains and other commodities used to make the pellet. Extra calcium is required for most livestock. Lime as limestone is an additional source of calcium.

What is the Mg source?

Irwins pellets can include several sources of magnesium. Magnesium is naturally in limestone and added seasonally as magnesium oxide and/or magnesium sulphate and a superfine green magnesium source from Base Prill.

What is Base Prill as listed in the product range ingredients?

Base Prill combines superfine calcium and magnesium to allow more of these minerals to be pelletized, without changing palatability. Base Prill also acts as a rumen buffer reducing the risk of acidosis.

Cereal Based with Barley, Maize, Wheat, Lupins, Faba Beans, Mill Run, Pea Pollard, Canola Meal, DDG, Hominy Meal, Salt, Bentonite.

What is in the mineral pre-mix?

Irwins mineral and vitamin pack provides six minerals and three vitamins included as standard across the cattle pellet range.

Minerals being Zinc, Manganese, Copper, Iodine, Cobalt, and Selenium.

Vitamin A, D3 and E are the added vitamins.
